WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County that the Country remain in one State Senatorial District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 11th day of February, 2002, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

1. Unanimously opposes dividing Nassau County into two Senatorial Districts.

2. Opposes said redistricting without consultation with the Board of County Commissioners and input from the Board of County Commissioners.


3. Urgently requests that the leadership and members of the Legislature receive testimony and/or meet with members of the Board of County Commissioners to address this very important matter.

- e. Minority leader of the Senate




