A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF MAY 18 THROUGH 24, 2003, AS HURRICANE AWARENESS WEEK IN NASSAU COUNTY.

WHEREAS, individuals must take personal responsibility for disaster preparedness and develop a disaster plan specific to their own needs.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 14th day of May, 2003, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:
