RESOLUTION NO. 2009-221

A RESOLUTION, PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2009-05, FINDING THAT IT IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE CITIZENS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, TO LEASE TO THE NASSAU COUNTY COUNCIL ON AGING, INC., REAL PROPERTY BEING THE PREMISES LOCATED AT 11 NORTH 14TH STREET, IN FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2009-05, finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County to lease to the Nassau County Council on Aging, Inc., a Florida non-profit corporation, property which is more particularly described in the legal description as attached hereto as Exhibit A, and which is more particularly described as being located at 11 North 14th Street, Fernandina Beach, Florida, also known as the Nassau County Office Annex property; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Council on Aging, Inc. is desirous of leasing the property from Nassau County, Florida, in order to construct a senior center facility that will serve the community needs by providing programs and activities; and

WHEREAS, the lease of said property would serve a vital public interest to the aged residents of Nassau County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County, Florida, that the property be utilized as a senior center facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this <u>14th</u> day of <u>December</u>, 2009, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida as follows:

1. The Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as the "County") finds that, pursuant to Ordinance 2009-05, subsection 5, it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County, Florida to enter into a ninety-nine (99) year lease agreement with the Nassau County Council on Aging, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as

the "Tenant"), in order for the Tenant to construct and operate on the premises a senior center facility to serve community needs.

- The Board of County Commissioners finds that a valid public purpose exists and that the needs of the senior citizens of Nassau County, Florida, will be served by leasing the described real property to the Nassau County Council on Aging, Inc., to operate a senior center facility for the elderly residents of Nassau County, Florida.
- The Board of County Commissioners finds that the term of the Lease Agreement (Contract No. CM1531) should be ninety-nine (99) years.
- 4. A finding has been made that the proposed use for the property is consistent with the County's adopted Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Regulations.
 - The Board of County Commissioners finds that in the event that the property to be leased to the Nassau County Council on Aging, Inc., is not used or ceases to be used for the stated purpose, the lease term shall immediately terminate.

This Resolution is hereby adopted at a public hearing on December 14, 2009, which was duly advertised.
