## A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE GULLAH/GEECHEE CULTURAL HERITAGE CORRIDOR COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the U.S. Secretary of the Interior appointed fifteen individuals to serve on the Gullah/Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor Commission for the purpose of developing a general management plan for the coastal communities and the Sea Islands, from Wilmington, North Carolina to Jacksonville, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Gullah/Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor Act, signed by President George W. Bush in 2006, mandates the development of a management plan to protect Gullah/Geechee culture, lands and waters within the Corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Gullah/Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor Commission led by Chairman Emory Campbell will visit Florida; and

WHEREAS, this will be the Commission's first visit to Florida as the federallyappointed body works to recognize and sustain an environment that celebrates the legacy and continuing contributions of Gullah/Geechee people to our American Heritage; and

WHEREAS, the meeting will be, in part, an exchange between the Gullah/Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor Commission and educators, preservationists, historians, clergy, community advocates and government officials at all levels in Nassau and Duval Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Commission will tour historic Gullah/Geechee communities, such as American Beach; and
