

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017- 134**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF  
NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROCLAIMING OCTOBER 2017 AS  
FLORIDA NATIVE PLANT MONTH.**

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Native Plant Society began in the summer of 1980 in Winter Park, Florida, by a group of scientists, educators, and conservationists concerned about the loss of Florida's native plants and the introduction of non-native species overtaking natural areas; and

**WHEREAS**, the mission of the Florida Native Plant Society is the preservation, conservation, and restoration of the native plants and native plant communities of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the Society now consists of 37 chapters and 3,950 members from all walks of life who volunteer their time, knowledge, and skills in public workshops, participating in Land Management Reviews, restoration projects, workdays and teaching Floridians about the many benefits of native plants; and


**WHEREAS**, Nassau County has an incredible wealth of natural areas to showcase Florida's native plants and native plant communities; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, this 25th day of September, 2017 that:


1. The month of October 2017 is hereby proclaimed as *Florida Native Plant Month* in Nassau County, Florida.


